VISION OF HAAM IS TO:

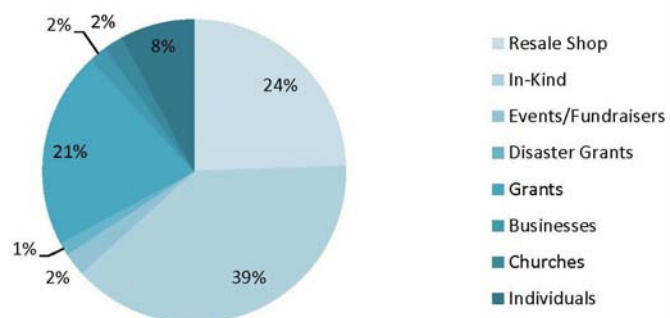
- Meet immediate basic living needs.

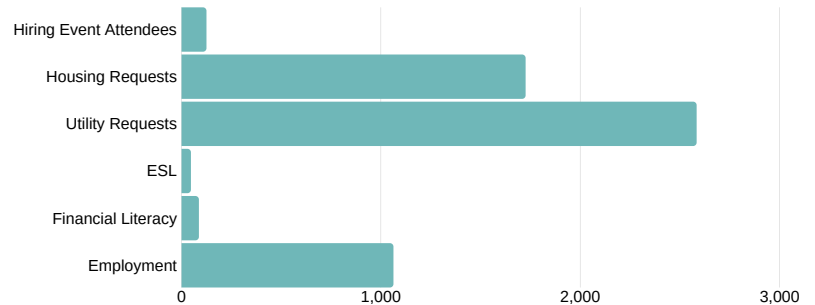
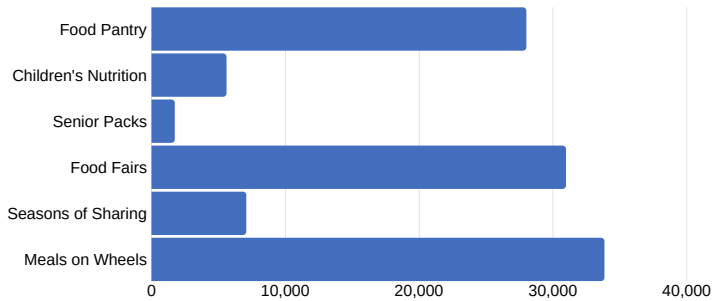
